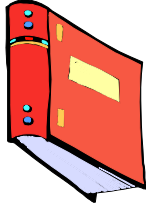

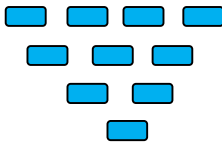

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Role-play 1

You have entered an hotel which you have pre-booked. The examiner will play the part of the receptionist and will speak first.

- You give your name and say you have booked a double room.
The receptionist will tell you there is no record of a booking in that name and ask when you booked the room and how.
- Tell him/her that you telephoned two weeks ago and spoke to a woman called Beryl.
Receptionist says Beryl left last week, they do have a double room available, how long would you want it.
- You say for seven nights and ask if it has a bath and a sea view
The receptionist will tell you that seven nights is fine, it has a sea view but there is only a shower.
- You say that you will take it but you are not happy.
The receptionist will apologise and offer you seven nights for the price of six.
- You accept and end the conversation appropriately.

Role-play 2

You have telephoned the local theatre to book tickets to see the pantomime. The examiner will play the part of the assistant and will speak first.

- You would like to know on which days there is a matinée.
The assistant will tell you they are on Saturdays and Sundays.
- You ask what time it starts.
The assistant will tell you at 2.30 but you should be there for 2 o'clock.
- You say you would like seats for 2 adults and 6 children and ask the cost.
The assistant will tell you that it is £20 per adult and £15 per child over the age of 3 in the upper part but £30 per adult and £20 per child in the stalls.
- You say you will take the stalls for the next Saturday.
The assistant will tell you that so many seats are only available on the Sunday
- You accept those seats and offer your credit card number.
The assistant will tell you that the tickets will be available at the desk.

Speaking 1 (30 marks)

There are 10 questions. Invigilators may change the questions, but the new question should be of an equivalent level of difficulty.

Question 1 is the confidence giving question, all candidates should get 3 marks.

The other questions each have a supplementary question, the first part gains 2 marks for a correct understandable answer, regardless of whether it is a complete sentence (this is conversation), one word answers may gain 1 mark. The remaining 1 mark is for an understandable answer to the supplementary question.

Ignore incorrect or missing mutations.

Relevant and correct	5 - 6 marks
